Mission Statement

The mission of the Cape May County Technical School District is to produce graduates with the necessary skills to compete in the global workplace; the knowledge to pursue higher education; avocational skills for personal growth; achievement of the NJ Core Curriculum Content Standards; and life-long learning experiences through the combination of academic, technological, co-curricular and specialty training.

History of Cape May County Technical High School

Cape May County, a peninsula, is located in the southern most part of New Jersey adjacent to the Great Sound estuary and salt marsh and bordered by an upland forest area. Cape May County Technical High School is a career focused public school of choice for high school students throughout Cape May County. It has been a full-time high school since 1993 moving from a shared-time vocational school to a full-time high school with a technical focus. The school enrolls 650 full-time students and 115 career technical students in grades nine through twelve.

Formerly known as Cape May County Vocational, the school began in 1915, offering mainly agricultural and domestic science. Today, the school's name has changed from vocational to technical. The school is a member of High Schools That Work, an educational initiative that focuses on raising student achievement. All academic courses are on the college preparatory, honors, or advanced placement levels, and students study pre-engineering, calculus, physics, foreign languages and computer technology in addition to the traditional technical programs. There are three National Academy Foundation programs – the Academy of Finance, Academy of Travel and Tourism, and Academy of Information Technology as well as Career Majors. Each career major is a specific program of study that introduces students to a range of related career choices within that career major. Career majors include Communication Arts Technology; Hospitality Technology; Environmental Technology; Health and Human Services Technology; Transportation Technology; and Construction Technology.

The Curriculum

The academic program is organized on a traditional nine-period day with technical courses taught for two periods each day. Students attend 180 days from September through June. Students must carry 40 credits per year and a minimum of 140 credits is required for graduation.

The Class of 2011 graduated with 135 students who met the following graduation requirements:

- Mathematics 15.00 (three years)
- Lab Science 15.00 (three years)
- Social Studies 15.00 (three years)
- Phys. Education/Health 20.00 (four years)
- World Language 10.00 (two years)
- Technical Concentration 40.00 (four years)
- Visual/Performing Art 5.00 (one year)

Honors Courses are offered in English, mathematics, science, and social studies

Advanced Placement (AP)

Calculus AB and English Literature and Composition are offered on campus during the 2011-2012 school year. Distance learning opportunities are also available in Advanced Placement Biology, English, Chemistry, and Physics.

Grading and Ranking

Students are ranked at the end of the 11th grade, at the end of the 1st semester of the 12th grade, and at the end of the 12th grade. Grades are assigned using a 4.0 system, and the GPA is calculated by dividing the total number of quality points earned by the number of credits attempted.

Physical education and applied class grades are not included in the calculation of the GPA. College preparatory, honors, and advanced placement courses receive additional weight.
