

Governor's Industry Vocations Scholarship

for Women & Minorities



In 2013, New Jersey introduced the Governor's Industry Vocations
Scholarship (NJ-GIVS), which pays up to \$2,000 per year or up to the cost of tuition, less any federal, State, or institutional aid in an eligible certificate or degree program at one of New Jersey's eligible institutions.
The scholarship is funded by the Schools Development Authority (SDA) and administered in partnership with HESAA. The award benefits women and minority students pursuing a certificate or degree program in a construction-related field.

According to N.J.S.A 52:18A-240, the Schools Development Authority must set aside a portion of the revenues from its construction contracts for training programs for women and minority group members.

To receive an NJ-GIVS award, you must be a female or a minority group member.

• As defined at N.J.A.C. 17:46-1.2, "Minority' means a person who is: 1) Black, which is a person having origins in any of the black racial groups in Africa; or 2) Hispanic, which is a person of Spanish or Portuguese culture, with origins in Mexico, South or Central America, or the Caribbean Islands, regardless of race; or 3) Asian American, which is a person having origins in any of the original peoples of the Far East, Southeast Asia, Indian Subcontinent, Hawaii or the Pacific Islands; or 4) American Indian or Alaskan native, which is a person having origins in any of the original peoples of North America."



- Students must complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) or NJ Alternative Financial Aid Application within established state deadlines and have an annual household income below \$60,000.
- Your award may be used at any of New Jersey's 19 county colleges, county vocational technical schools or a proprietary trade school provided the school is affiliated with an institution that is eligible to participate in the New Jersey Tuition Aid Grant (TAG) program.
- Students must be citizens, eligible non-citizens or eligible to file the NJ Alternative Financial Aid Application.

- Male award recipients will be required to prove they have registered with the Selective Service System.
- New Jersey grants and scholarships are limited to New Jersey residents. A New Jersey resident must have resided in the State for at least 12 consecutive months immediately prior to receiving the award.
- Students must have a high school diploma or GED equivalent to be eligible.

AWARD - PAYMENT - RENEWAL

After classes start and HESAA receives confirmation of your enrollment status and you are meeting the school's standard of satisfactory academic progress, payment will be sent to your college, vocational, or proprietary school.

The award is renewable for one year depending on the availability of SDA funds and the program in which you are enrolled. To renew for a second year, you must continue to meet all eligibility requirements and:

- 1. Complete an NJ-GIVS application at www.njgrants.org
- 2. Students must complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) or NJ Alternative Financial Aid Application within established state deadlines
- 3. Enroll at an eligible institution
- 4. Maintain satisfactory academic progress
